Location and Seating Notice

We are downstairs in the OYH Hall until Shemini Atzeret/Simchat Torah when we will be back upstairs. We have made every effort to accommodate seating requests. However, due to limited availability and high demand, we regret that not all preferences could be fulfilled. We appreciate your understanding.

Yom Kippur Guidelines (Rabbi Golker)

- Vidui (confession) is said at Mincha on erev Yom Kippur, as found in the Machzor
- There is a strong minhag for men to visit the mikvah on erev Yom Kippur.
- The Seudah Hamafseket should be eaten after Mincha.
- Candles should be lit by 6.24pm. Remember to light a 25-hour candle as well (to be used for Havdalah see below).
- The mitzvah of Tosefet Yom Kippur means that the fast and prohibitions of the day should be accepted before sunset (i.e.: At candle-lighting time or just before).
- One who is seriously unwell may be required to not fast Rabbinic and medical advice should be sought on a caseby-case basis, ahead of time, in order to establish who is exempt from fasting, and under what circumstances.
- The fast goes out at 7.23pm. At the conclusion of Yom Kippur, Havdalah is made over wine/grape juice and a candle. The bracha on fire can only be recited on a candle that was burning the entire Yom Kippur (נר ששבת), or from a light kindled from such a candle.

To help maintain a warm and respectful atmosphere, we've set up the basement multipurpose room as a space for children. Please remember that a parent must stay with them in this room at all times. For children who are not using this area, we kindly ask that they remain seated with their parents throughout the service. If your child is making noise or needs attention, even during your own private Amida, please do step away and tend to them. We encourage everyone to supervise their own children, limiting movement between the men's and women's sections to avoid distracting others. To keep our space comfortable for everyone, we also ask that footballs are not brought along, and scooters are parked on arrival and not used in the playground. We truly value a sense of community, and if adults would like to have conversations, we kindly request that you wait for a break or step outside. Likewise, if little ones get a bit too noisy or need a quick break, stepping outside for a moment can ensure the service remains a positive experience for all. 



Additional Information (first days)

- Candle lighting (remember to light 2-day candle) on Monday 6 October from 5.17pm
- Candle lighting from an existing flame on Tuesday 7 October from 7.12pm | No work for the second day before nightfall at 7.12pm
- Rain on first night: if it seems the rain may stop, wait an hour or two for it to subside in order to recite full Kiddush and eat in the succah. If members of the household are hungry and/or tired and waiting will unduly the disturb the enjoyment of Yom Tov then one is not required to wait. In such a case or if the rain appears steady and likely to continue throughout the night, one should make Kiddush (without the bracha of Leishev baSuccah) and eat a k'zayis of bread in the succah. The rest of the meal can continue in the house. If one has an opportunity to eat in the succah after the rain stops, then it is preferable to return to the succah, recite the bracha of Leishev BaSuccah and eat a k'beitzah of bread.
